



**Parks and Recreation Advisory Board Meeting Minutes

The Parks and Recreation Board Meeting was called to order at 5:34 pm by Sunshine Szedeli who conducted the meeting.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Dana made a motion to approve the minutes of July 14, 2021. Ted seconded the motion. Approval was unanimous.

CITIZEN COMMENTS

There were no citizen comments.

PAVILION 5 UPDATE

Kim shared that construction of Pavilion 5 is within budget and is projected to be completed by October 8, 2021. The interior wood ceiling has been completed, the metal roof is nearly finished, and restrooms are about halfway done. Picnic tables are still backordered. The first event expected to be held at the pavilion is Murray Power Days on October 14, 2021.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Kim shared that the Mayor's office has been notified of the Board's recommendation to support the full amount proposed in Zion Bank's Park Impact Fee Report. A future council meeting will be scheduled to discuss the proposal.

Open positions within the Parks and Recreation department include Park Center Assistant Director and Recreation Coordinator. The interview process for the Park Center Assistant Director will begin this week.

The Park Center closed today until Wednesday, August 18, 2021 for annual maintenance and cleaning of the building. The leisure pool has a leak that will be repaired. The flooring company determined that the floor in the gym will last another year so plans to refinish it were canceled.

Starting next week, the outdoor pool will only be open on Saturdays and Sundays, with Labor Day being the last business day of the season. Additionally, this Friday, August 13, 2021 will be the last day of work for most seasonal park maintenance workers because school starts next week.

Fall soccer begins tomorrow with 700 participants enrolled.

On Friday, August 13, 2021, Murray City will be hosting a parade honoring Murray High Alumni Nathaniel Coleman. He earned a silver medal in men's combined sport climbing at the 2021 Tokyo Olympics. The parade will begin at Vine Street and end at Constitution Circle, where a small stage will be set up for Mayor Camp and Nathaniel to address the crowd.

MANSION UPDATE - Lori Edmunds, Cultural Arts Director

Lori informed the Board that work has started on the floors at the Mansion. Bids for the windows opened today and there are two bids to choose from.
