

## Swamp White Oak: Not suitable to plant under powerlines.

<b>Description</b>	Stiff branches create a broad, pyramid to rounded crown and dark green leaves become golden with orange and red in fall. Bark sheds in ragged, papery flakes aging to a thicker, dark gray brown. Great winter interest. Swamp White Oak will tolerate both wet or dry conditions. Not recommend in areas with extremely high PH. Hardy to -30°F Maximum Elevation: 7,000 ft.

## Kwanzan Cherry:

<b>Description</b>	Narrow and upright in form, but compact in height, this flowering cherry is well suited for urban landscapes. It avoids frost damage by flowering a week or two later than is typical of the species. Fall color is consistently bright, and its upright symmetry gives winter appeal. Hardy to -40°F Maximum Elevation: 6,500 ft.

## Ivory Silk Japanese Tree Lilac:

<b>Description</b>	A most attractive, small flowering tree with a compact, oval growth habit. Large, creamy white flower clusters bloom in early summer among the rich green foliage. The shiny bark is quite attractive. Hardy to -20°F Maximum Elevation: 6,000 Feet

## Frontier Elm: Not suitable to plant under powerlines.

<b>Description</b>	This Elm is resistant to Dutch Elm Disease. It has reddish-purple fall color. Very tough and tolerant of a wide variety of conditions. This tree is a cross between Lacebark Elm and Smooth Leaf Elm. Hardy to -30°F Maximum Elevation: 6,000 ft.
